EDUCATIONAL RESOURCE

Write a story describing the journey of a plastic bottle. This plastic bottle was thrown away in a busy city inland, next to a polluted river. Tell the story of how it makes its way from the city and out to sea.

Where does the plastic bottle end up? How far does it travel? What sea creatures might it encounter along the way? Does it get eaten by a sea creature mistaking it for food?

Bring the plastic bottle to life by writing your story as if you were the plastic bottle:

- Is there a problem you encounter along the way? How do you solve this problem?
- Before writing, use a story planner or mountain to help you think about the beginning, middle and end of your story.
- Make your sentences super by using exciting verbs and adjectives.

After finishing your story, why not draw a scene from your story or create a poster encouraging people to use reusable items instead of single-use plastic!
